Since opening in 1996, Las Vegas Motor Speedway has played host to some of the most exciting racing events across several national motorsports series.

- **Location:** Clark County, north of Las Vegas, Nevada
- **Capacity:** 131,000
- **Owner:** Speedway Motorsports, Inc.
- **Tracks**
 - Super Speedway: 1.5 miles (2.4 km) oval
 - The Strip: 0.25 mile (0.402 km) drag strip
 - Inside Road Course: 1.1 miles (1.8 km), with a 0.76 mile (1.22 km) road configuration and a 0.33 mile (530 m) oval configuration
 - Outside Road Course: 2.4 miles (3.9 km)
 - The Bullring: 0.375 mile (604 m) paved oval
 - Dirt Track: 0.5 mile (800 m) clay oval
 - Exotics Racing Course: 1.4 miles (2.25 km) road course, with a 1.2 miles (1.9 km) configuration
 - Off-road Course: an 850 by 750 feet (260 by 230 meter) area that may accommodate multiple configurations
